First we headed to the new (3 yrs old) hangar where excess planes are stored. There were a large number of planes right from a Volksplane to an Argus, plus there were a great number of spare engines and parts. Gerry gave us a brief history of everything he could think of. This was absolutely great, considering the fact that not many people even get to go through this hangar.

From here, we went to the restoration shops where we saw a Rolls Royce Merlin just finished, and a Grumman Wigon (from the Warplane Heritage Museum) which was in for some winter work. We also saw the start of some restoration on a German ME 109 that actually had some bullet holes in it, which it got while sitting in a hangar. The wood working and metal shops were just amazing.

Next we got to the museum itself. The revitalization is almost complete. The emphasis now is Canadian Aviation, from 1909 – 2009 (except for the Harrier). There are bush, northern, civil, and military planes, all with good descriptions.

This is a must see for anyone interested in aviation. There is talk underway about adding an auditorium and a larger parking lot soon.
